Executive Summary:

Warrior Care RCP, in collaboration with the Interagency Veterans Advisory Council (IVAC), is strengthening federal partnerships to expand career and education opportunities for recovering Service members (RSMs).

IVAC plays a critical role in coordinating federal efforts to improve veteran employment outcomes across agencies. Warrior Care supports this mission by providing pathways to talent through:

- Operation Warfighter (OWF) – federal internship placements
